Our community fridge is meant to work in similar fashion to the Swift Current Community Fridge located downtown. The Community Fridge is located in Student Services and is for ALL students to access however, the availability of food depends on donations.

A special thank you to our SCC, who provided over 1000 muffins to kick-start the initiative, as well as Swift Thrift who has donated 100% of their proceeds to Comp Eats. PRINTING HACKS TO SAVE TREES



Help save paper and save the trees with these printing habits.

- **Review your document before printing.**

Check for typos, missing information, or mistakes before printing.

- **Print double-sided when possible.**

Click on *More Settings* and check the *Print on both sides* option to use both sides of a sheet of paper and halve your paper use.

- **Use the page selection option.**

Print only the pages you need by using the *custom page selection* option in the printing settings.

- **Check the last page.**

Delete the blank page at the end of your document. If you can't delete it, use the page selection settings to exclude it from your printing job.

- **Print individual pages.**

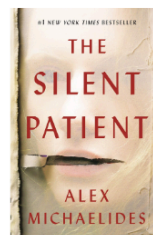
Instead of printing the whole document to fix any mistakes, use the *custom page selection* option to print individual pages.

- **Reuse and recycle paper.**

Reuse paper that has only been printed on one side. After using both sides, place it in one of the many recycling bins across the school.

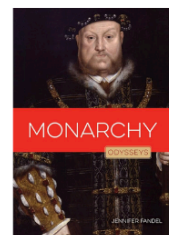
