COMP EATS + CLASSROOM EATS NUTRITION PROGRAM AT SCCHS







Check for typos, missing information, or mistakes before printing.

• Print double-sided when possible.

Click on More Settings and check the Print on both sides option to use both sides of a sheet of paper and halve your paper use.

• Use the page selection option.

Print only the pages you need by using the custom page selection option in the printing settings.

Check the last page.

Delete the blank page at the end of your document. If you can't delete it, use the page selection settings to exclude it from your printing job.

Print individual pages.

Instead of printing the whole document to fix any mistakes, use the custom page selection option to print individual pages.

• Reuse and recycle paper.

Reuse paper that has only been printed on one side. After using both sides, place it in one of the many recycling bins across the school.




